
The Faculty of the School of Nursing cordially invite you and your parents to attend an informal coffee party which will be held in the Ballroom immediately after registration on February eleventh.

A. ITEMS TO BE PURCHASED AT THE HOSPITAL (approximate cost - \$185.00)

Re Uniforms and Aprons. Measurements are taken at THE VANCOUVER GARMENTS LIMITED. If living in or near Vancouver, your earliest attention to this will keep delayed measurements to a minimum.

If for any reason withdrawal from the course is necessary after you enter the School, uniforms, aprons and cape cannot be returned for a refund.

B. ADDITIONAL EXPENSES (not included in estimated cost of \$185.00) is approximately \$30.00 and includes first pair of shoes.

1. Two pairs of black oxfords (approximate cost - \$20.00). First pair to be purchased after arrival and second pair to be purchased six months later.


C. ITEMS YOU ARE REQUESTED TO BRING WITH YOU (purchased independently and not included in estimated cost of \$185.00).

- ✓ 1. Wrist watch with second hand.
- ✓ 2. Alarm clock.
- ✓ 3. Fountain pen.

4. Three three-ring, hard-covered notebooks - standard size $11\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- ✓ 5. Two laundry bags (drawstring closure) made of strong white material 36" x 36".
- ✓ 6. Hot water bottle.
- ✓ 7. Clothes hangers.
- ✓ 8. Dressing gown, bedroom slippers and face cloths.
9. One pair navy blue shorts, one yellow "T" shirt, running shoes.
- ✓ 10. It is recommended that you have a navy blue tailored raincoat - "Burberry" type.
11. Navy blue Basque beret.
- ✓ 12. Umbrella.
13. Six pairs of black hose (nylon or service weight).
- ✓ 14. Bathing suit, cap and beach towel.
- ✓ 15. Cup, saucer, plate, knife, fork and spoon for personal use in the Residence.
- ✓ 16. Laundry soap, safety pins, hairnets.
- ✓ 17. All clothing should be marked plainly with owner's FULL NAME, using either name tapes or cloth marking ink. Please bring new tapes or cloth marking ink and pen with you.

NOTE: Only those lamps and irons provided by the Residence may be used. An electric clock, radio, record player and shaver are the only electrical articles you may bring for use in the Residence. Because of the construction of the building, radio reception is not very satisfactory on small, portable radios. It is not permissible to bring any article that heats.
